Gov. Beshear announces Transportation Enhancement funding for Taylorsville Project will 'enhance quality of life' for community FRANKFORT, Ky. - Gov. Steve Beshear today announced that the city of Taylorsville has been selected to receive \$360,000 in Transportation Enhancement funding to invest in a sidewalk project.

"The Taylorsville streetscape project will improve access to businesses and services for residents and visitors alike," said Gov. Beshear. "Our administration is proud to support the efforts of a progressive community to provide a safe, healthy and attractive environment and to enhance the quality of life for its citizens."

The funding will allow for sidewalk improvements along both sides of main street (KY 44) in the downtown historic district. The phase II improvement project includes the replacement of aging sidewalks, relocation of utility poles and the addition of decorative street lighting, benches, planters and landscaping. The project will increase pedestrian and vehicular safety to the area.

Transportation Enhancement programs, which are administered by the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet, offer federal funding for creative approaches that integrate environmentally friendly transportation solutions into communities.

"The citizens of Taylorsville can be proud of their community, and our cabinet is honored to be able to support their efforts in creating a viable travel alternative," said Transportation Secretary Joe Prather.
